Robert (Rob) W. Theisen, Jr., founder and chairman of Tilt-Con Corporation, one of the nation's largest tilt-up concrete construction firms. As chairman of Tilt-Con, Theisen leads a statewide staff of more than 450 employees strong. A leading authority in the tilt-up concrete construction industry for more than 25 years, he was nominated to the American Concrete Institute Tilt-Up Construction Committee. In that position, Theisen helped develop the widely used industry reference, "The State-of-the-Art for Tilt-Up Construction."

Tilt-Con is the most awarded tilt-up concrete construction company in America by the Tilt-Up Concrete Association. Tilt-Con is recognized as Engineering News Record's Top 600 Specialty Contractors in America, F.W. Dodge's Top 150 Specialty Contractors in the Southeast and Best Concrete Project in 2005 by Southeast Construction magazine.

Theisen's success in the tilt-up industry is matched only by his dedication to the industry and the community. In April 2000, Theisen was appointed by Governor Jeb Bush to serve a four-year term on the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority Board and was reappointed in 2004 to another four-year term. In 2003, Governor Bush also appointed Theisen to the Wekiva Coordinating Committee, a group empowered to help balance the protection of the Wekiva Basin Watershed with the protection of property right.

Born in Altadena, Calif., Theisen moved to Florida in 1970. Today, he lives in Longwood with his wife, Cynthia, and their two sons. He has been an active coach and umpire for youth baseball for more than 35 years, and shares with his wife a wide range of involvement in numerous charitable and civic organizations.
